

Pre-Academic Training (PAT) – terms and conditions

APPLICATION

1. Students can apply via the website by submitting an application form and supporting documentation. Applications will only be reviewed once they are complete. Acceptance is considered as provisional pending receipt of online payment (credit card or wire transfer). No rights can be derived from this.
2. By submitting an application form the student certifies that he/she has read, understood and complies with all PAT regulations.
3. Registration closes on 15 June 2018.

PLACEMENT AND ADMISSION

4. PAT reserves the right to assess the student's entry level in order to determine eligibility and admission.
5. In the event that a course is oversubscribed, places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

CANCELLATION BY THE PRE-ACADEMIC TRAINING

6. PAT reserves the right to cancel a course. Students will be informed within one week after 15 June 2018 about the status of the course.
7. Should a course be cancelled, the tuition fee will be refunded in full.

CANCELLATION BY THE STUDENT

8. If a student withdraws 6 weeks or more before the start of the course, no costs will be incurred. If a student withdraws between 6 and 4 weeks before the start of the course, PAT will charge 10% of the tuition fee. If a student withdraws between 4 and 2 weeks, PAT will charge 25% of the tuition fee. If a student withdraws between 2 weeks and the start of the course, PAT will charge 50% of the tuition fee. If a student withdraws after the course has started, PAT will charge 100% of the tuition fee.
9. Tuition will be refunded in full should the student's visa be denied.
10. Tuition will be refunded in full should the student fail to obtain the diploma required to start their education at Maastricht University.
11. Exceptions to the abovementioned cancellation regulations will be reviewed by PAT on a case-by-case basis.

FINAL PROVISION

12. Should circumstances arise for which the existing terms and conditions do not provide, PAT aims to resolve the matter amicably. If an amicable settlement cannot be reached, the matter will be brought before the Maastricht Court, in accordance to Dutch Law.
