Addendum EER FSE master programmes 2022-2023

In light of the aftermath of the COVID-19 impact, the Executive Board decided that the soft-cut regulation will be extended for the academic year 2022-2023.

I. Soft-cut-regulation

Temporary derogatory condition for enrolment in the (pre) master 2022-2023

- In accordance with Article 7.37c and in derogation from Articles 2.1, 2.2, 2.2a, 2.3, 2.6 and 2.7 of the EER the programme may, at its request, register for a 'registration without completed prior education' ('zachte knip-regulation') for the programme, if:
 - a. the candidate has obtained at least 80% of the credits to be obtained from the last year of the previous education (bachelor or bridging programme (pre-master)) (e.g. max. 12 ECTS from year 3 of the bachelor may be missing, year 1 and year 2 have been completed in full) OR has obtained all credits except the bachelor thesis.
 - b. the candidate wants to enrol from a bridging minor ("schakelprogramma"), at least the bridging component offered by FSE-DACS has been completed. Subsequently, the programme, considering the 80% standard, assesses whether the student in question can be enrolled on the basis of the prior knowledge obtained in relation to the load of the subsequent programme;
 - c. the candidate has completed the prior education at least one month before the (pre) master's program, but no later than 31 August 2023.
- This arrangement applies to the academic year 2022-2023 and will expire if the diploma for the previous education (bachelor or bridging programme) is not obtained before 1 September 2023;
- 3. The period of validity of passed examinations during the 'registration without completed prior education' in 2022-2023 is bound according to Article 5.13 of the EER.
- 4. The bachelor's thesis has been completed before the master's thesis can be started.
