# Important deadlines for this study programme

- The master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management starts in September
- The deadlines below are applicable for applying for a start September 2024

When you want to apply or are applying to for this study programme, it is important that you inform yourself of the deadlines that you need to meet. The important deadlines when applying for this study programme are provided in the table below.

Up to and including 1 June 2024, 23:59 CET	Deadline for completing the entire application process for applicants from <b>the EU/EEA or Switzerland</b>
Up to and including 31 August 2024, 23:59 CET	Deadline for providing the UM with information on your previous statistics education
Up to and including 1 February 2024, 23:59 CET	Application deadline for non-EU/EEA applicants who want to be considered for the UM High Potential/Holland Scholarship.

## Graduates from a relevant university bachelor's programme

You qualify for admission with:

- a relevant bachelor's degree from a Dutch university;
- a relevant bachelor's degree from an EEA university;
- a relevant bachelor's degree from a non-EEA university;
- a relevant university master's degree.

### **Direct qualification for admission**

Students who obtained a bachelor's degree at a Dutch university in Health Sciences (track Biology and Health) or in Biomedical Sciences, as well as students with a bachelor's degree in Nutrition and Health, qualify directly for admission. They do not need to write a letter of motivation.

Please note: you have to pass your bachelor's exam before 1 September 2024

## **Statistics**

Some candidates need to complete a statistics course. The statistics course should focus on statistics for life sciences and at least include knowledge on statistical comparison tests and use of statistical analysis software, such as SPSS. You can complete a statistics course at Maastricht University or at another institute.

More information on the required contents of the course on statistics will be discussed during the admissions interview.

Please note: if statistics was part of your bachelor's programme, you will have to upload the following documents before 31 August 2024 in the MyApplication portal under the task 'Prove proficiency in statistics':

- Proof of all relevant statistics courses that you followed during your bachelor's programme
- A separate Word document with the following information:
  - Name of the course(s)
  - Number of credits you received
  - Short description of the course(s) (max. 10 sentences per course)

If you did not take any statistics courses during your previous education, please upload a document stating this.

## **Documents required for application process**

During the application process for this study programme you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare.

### Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

- A recent passport picture The passport picture must satisfy certain <u>requirements</u>
- A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card\* Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.
- A copy of your most recent certified grades transcript/diploma If you have not graduated yet, you can upload your official grades transcript from your bachelor's programme.
- Your curriculum vitae Please list your education, relevant extracurricular activities and internship/professional experience.
- A letter of motivation Please provide good arguments about why you want to do this master's programme at Maastricht University and why you believe that you can successfully complete the programme.

\*As a UM student it is not necessary to upload these documents in the MyApplication portal. Unless your passport is not valid on 1 September 2024; in that case you do have to upload a copy of your passport.

## Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

• Document(s) that demonstrate your proficiency in English

Answer the questions concerning language requirements under 'Language requirements for English-language master's programmes' on this webpage to find out if you need to provide additional documentation. The outcome of your answers will indicate which documents you can use to prove your proficiency.

• Statistics (if applicable)

If statistics was not part of your university (of applied sciences (HBO)) bachelor's programme, you will have to complete a statistics course. The statistics course should focus on statistics for life sciences and at least include knowledge on statistical comparison tests and use of statistical analysis software, such as SPSS. You can complete a statistics course at Maastricht University or at another institute. ## How do we assess your application?

When you want to apply or are applying for this study programme, it is useful to know how we assess your application. You can find more information about this below.

For the master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management, admission takes place on the basis of your previous education and suitability. For this, your motivation and your prior qualifications are important.

Students who have completed certain bachelor's programmes at Maastricht University qualify directly for admission. Students who graduated within another relevant university domain, have to provide a complete file which will be assessed by the Board of Admissions. An entrance interview is (in most cases) also part of the admissions process.

The interview focuses on your academic plans and how you intend to accomplish these through an education at the master's in Health Food Innovation Management. The starting point for the interview is your letter of motivation, CV and transcript. The interview is conducted in English by one or two staff members and lasts approximately 30-45 minutes. It is an informative meeting and usually takes place at Campus Venlo or, for international students, via Microsoft Teams.

Assessment of your file happens on a rolling basis. This means that, once you submit a complete file, it will be presented to the Board of Admission. We will not wait until the deadline before we present your file to the Board. You will receive a decision within two to four weeks after completion of your file.

Note: only **complete** applications will be assessed. We therefore recommend that you adhere to the deadlines provided in the table under 'Important deadlines for this study programme' on this page.
