Selection

The bachelor Psychology is a fixus programme with <u>selection</u> by the educational institution. This means that you go through a selection procedure after applying. Not everybody who meets the admission requirements will also be offered a place in the study programme. The UM performs a pre-selection, afterwards Studielink takes care of the allocation procedure. Only a limited number of students can be admitted each year, 500 for the academic year 2025-2026.

For the academic year 2025-2026, all available places will be allocated by means of selection.

Please note: in Studielink you must directly make a choice between the Dutch (4501) and English (4501_T1) track. Switching tracks is not possible.

Are you a non-EU citizen requiring a visa/residence permit for study?

Please note that Maastricht University can **only** formally apply for your visa/residence permit if you have met all admission and enrolment requirements.

This means you have to have completed all admission and enrolment tasks in the MyApplication portal (except the tasks 'Arrange visa / legal residence' and 'Send certified copy of diploma') before we can send your application to the IND (Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Service).

We have to send the application to the IND before 1 July if you are starting your studies in September. Please note: A few pre-master's and master's programmes offer a start in February. If you are applying to start your studies in February, we have to send the application to the IND before 1 December. You can find out if your study programme offers a start in February on the admission requirements web page of that programme (pre-master's, master's).

Therefore, we **strongly recommend** that you reconsider applying for this study programme if you are not sure

that you will meet the following requirements before 1 July/1 December (if applicable in your situation):

- Having remedied all subject and/or language deficiencies (if applicable)
- Having qualified for admission to your study programme, including being selected (<u>if applicable to your study programme</u>) AND
- Having paid the tuition fee for your study programme

General requirements: previous education

The admission requirements for academic year 2025-2026 for the bachelor's programme in Psychology depend on your previous education. Please check below which requirements apply to you.

Applicants with a Dutch VWO or HBO propaedeutic diploma

If you possess one of the diplomas stated below then, in principle, you qualify for admission.

- VWO diploma: all profiles
- All HBO propaedeutic diplomas

Applicants with a non-Dutch diploma

If you have a non-Dutch diploma that is equivalent to the Dutch VWO (pre-university secondary school) diploma you qualify, in principle, for admission to this programme. Check if this applies for your diploma.

List of diplomas equivalent to the Dutch VWO diploma 2025-2026

If your diploma is not included in this list, it must be evaluated first. UM will assess whether you qualify for admission on individual basis.

Applicants without the appropriate diploma and 21 years of age or older

If you do not have the necessary diplomas, you may still be eligible for admission based on the Colloquium Doctum. For this, you must be 21 years of age or older.

The UM Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience does not organise a Colloquium Doctum exam. You must demonstrate with certificates that you have mastered the required subjects (Biology, Mathematics and English) at **Dutch VWO-level new style**.

Application

Please submit and complete your application before 15 January 2025 and indicate in Studielink that you want to be admitted based on the Colloquium Doctum. The following documents need to be uploaded in the MyApplication portal:

- a copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card
- a statement in the MyApplication Portal in which you declare that it is a Colloquium Doctum application

Please note: In order to be admitted based on the Colloquium Doctum you must arrange obtaining the certificates yourself.

- For the Biology and Mathematics exams, you can go to <u>Boswell-Bèta</u> and/or <u>Central Committees for Entrance</u> <u>Exams (CCVX) – entrance exam</u>
- For the English subject exams, you can go to <u>Babel</u> and/or the <u>UM Language Centre</u>.
- IELTS: 6.0
- TOEFL iBT: 80
- TOEIC listening and reading: 670; speaking and writing: 290
- Cambridge First B2: Grade B (scale 173-175) or, Grade C (scale 169-172)
- TOEFL Paper-delivered Test: Reading: 20-30; Listening: 20-30

Once you have successfully completed your additional examinations, you need to upload the three certificates in the MyApplication portal. Once uploaded, notify the UM Admissions Office via study@maastrichtuniversity.nl.

Applicants who started a bachelor's in Psychology at another university

Applicants who started a bachelor's programme in Psychology at another university and who wish to transfer to the Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience at Maastricht University must follow the same application and enrolment process as all other applicants (including the selection procedure). Note that you must apply as a first-year student in Studielink before 15 January 2025.

In case you are offered a place in the bachelor's programme after completing the selection and once you are fully enrolled (including payment of the tuition fee) as a student at Maastricht University, you can request exemptions based on your pre-university education. The Board of Examiners will assess requests for credit transfer and will determine which courses you are exempted from. Important information regarding exemptions and how to apply for them can be found here.

Selection procedure

The **selection procedure**, which consists of an online questionnaire and online test, **will be accessible** in the MyApplication portal around 1 February 2025.

The selection procedure covers the following subjects:

- study attitude
- motivation
- secondary education grades
- video lectures
- digital literature
- an online test

You can complete the selection procedure in parts and even go back to change your answers.

You can do all of the parts online at a time that suits you. You must complete the selection procedure before **1 March 2025**, **16:59 CET**. Make sure you start on time.

Please note: once you have submitted the selection test, it cannot be changed and you cannot retake it.

Please note: over the years, you're allowed to participate in the selection procedure for this programme up to three times (selection attempts). Each year, one selection procedure takes place.

Assessment and ranking score

The criteria examined during your assessment are: your motivation, your secondary education grades, your study attitude and orientation, and your score on the test that is part of our selection procedure.

Based on the results the UM ranks the candidates. On **15 April 2025** you'll be informed about your ranking number via Studielink.

The allocation starts at the top of the ranking. Students who are offered a place, based on their ranking number, must **confirm/accept** their place in Studielink **within 14 days (14x24 hrs.)** after they have been offered a place. This is an absolute deadline!

Note: only complete applications will be assessed. We therefore recommend that you adhere to the deadlines provided in the table under 'Important deadlines for application' on this page.

Selection attempts

Over the years, you're allowed to participate in the selection procedure for this programme up to three times (selection attempts). Each year, one selection procedure takes place.
