### Admission requirements

On this page, you will find important details of the application process (such as deadlines, admission requirements, required documents and application assessment) for the master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management for the *academic year 2025-2026*.

### Important deadlines for application

The master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management starts in September.

The deadlines below are applicable for applying for applicants who want to start their studies in September 2025

**Note:** If you are viewing this webpage on your phone, we recommend that you use landscape mode.

1 October 2024	Studielink is open for applications for the academic year 2025-2026
1 May 2025, 23:59 CET	Deadline for completing the entire application process for <b>non-EU/EEA</b> applicants (these applicants require a <u>visa</u> or residence permit)
1 June 2025, 23:59 CET	Deadline for completing the entire application process for applicants from the EU/EEA or Switzerland
31 August 2025, 23:59 CET	Deadline for providing the UM with information on your previous statistics education
1 February 2025, 23:59 CET	Application deadline for non-EU/EEA applicants who want to be considered for the UM High Potential/Holland Scholarship.

#### Please note:

In Studielink you need to choose the starting moment.
Please make sure to select September 2025 in the pulldown menu, so that you will apply for the start of the next academic year

## Are you a non-EU citizen requiring a visa/residence permit for study?

Please note that Maastricht University can **only** formally apply for your visa/residence permit if you have met all admission and enrolment requirements.

This means you have to have completed all admission and enrolment tasks in the MyApplication portal (except the tasks 'Arrange visa / legal residence' and 'Send certified copy of diploma') before we can send your application to the IND (Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Service).

We have to send the application to the IND before 1 July if you are starting your studies in September. Please note: A few pre-master's and master's programmes offer a start in February. If you are applying to start your studies in February, we have to send the application to the IND before 1 December. You can find out if your study programme offers a start in February on the admission requirements web page of that programme (pre-master's, master's).

Therefore, we **strongly recommend** that you reconsider applying for this study programme if you are not sure that you will meet the following requirements before 1 July/1 December (if applicable in your situation):

- Having remedied all subject and/or language deficiencies (if applicable)
- Having qualified for admission to your study programme, including being selected (<u>if applicable to your study programme</u>) AND
- Having paid the tuition fee for your study programme

#### General requirements: previous education

The admission requirements for academic year 2025-2026 for the master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management depend on your previous education. Please check below which requirements apply to you.

For the master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management, admission takes place on the basis of your previous education and suitability. For this, your motivation and your prior qualifications are important.

## Pre-master's in Health Food Innovation Management

### Graduates from a relevant university bachelor's programme

You qualify for admission if you have:

- a relevant bachelor's degree from a Dutch university;
- a relevant bachelor's degree from an EU/EEA university;
- a relevant bachelor's degree from a non-EU/EEA university;
- a relevant university master's degree.

#### Direct qualification for admission

Students who obtained a bachelor's degree at a Dutch university in Health Sciences (track Biology and Health) or in Biomedical Sciences, as well as students with a bachelor's degree in Nutrition and Health, qualify directly for admission. They do not need to write a letter of motivation.

**Please note**: You have to pass your bachelor's exam before 1 September 2025.

#### **Statistics**

Some candidates need to complete a statistics course. The statistics course should focus on statistics for life sciences and at least include knowledge on statistical comparison tests and the use of statistical analysis software, such as SPSS. You can complete a statistics course at Maastricht University or at another institute.

More information on the required contents of the course on statistics will be discussed during the admissions interview.

If statistics was part of your bachelor's programme, you will have to upload the following documents before 31 August 2025 in the MyApplication portal under the task 'Prove proficiency in statistics':

- Proof of all relevant statistics courses that you followed during your bachelor's programme
- A separate Word document with the following information:

- Name of the course(s)
- Number of credits you received
- Short description of the course(s) (max. 10 sentences per course)

If you did not take any statistics courses during your previous education, please upload a document stating this.

## Required documents for all applicants to this \_ study programme

- A recent passport picture requirements.

  'Upload portrait picture' in the MyApplication portal.
- A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card\*

  Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.
- A copy of your most recent grades transcript/diploma

  If you have not graduated yet, you can upload your official
  grades transcript from your bachelor's programme.
- Your curriculum vitae

  Please list your education, relevant extracurricular activities
  and internship/professional experience.
- A letter of motivation

\*As a UM student it is not necessary to upload these documents in the MyApplication portal unless your passport will not be valid on 1 September 2025. In that case, you do have to upload a copy of your passport..

- Statistics information (if statistics was part of your bachelor's programme)

You can upload these documents in the MyApplication portal under the task 'Prove proficiency in statistics'.

### How do we assess your application?

For the master's programme in Health Food Innovation Management, admission takes place on the basis of your previous education and suitability. For this, your motivation and your prior qualifications are important.

Students who have completed certain bachelor's programmes at Maastricht University qualify directly for admission. Students who graduated within another relevant university domain, have to provide a complete file which will be assessed by the Board of Admissions. An entrance interview is (in most cases) also part of the admissions process.

The interview focuses on your academic plans and how you intend to accomplish these through an education at the master's in Health Food Innovation Management. The starting point for the interview is your letter of motivation, CV and transcript. The interview is conducted in English by one or two staff members and lasts approximately 30-45 minutes. It is an

informative online meeting that usually takes place at Campus Venlo or, for international students, via Microsoft Teams.
