Application deadlines

Are you a non-EU citizen requiring a visa/residence permit for study?

Please note that Maastricht University can **only** formally apply for your visa/residence permit if you have met all admission and enrolment requirements.

This means you have to have completed all admission and enrolment tasks in the MyApplication portal (except the tasks 'Arrange visa / legal residence' and 'Send certified copy of diploma') before we can send your application to the IND (Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Service).

We have to send the application to the IND **before 1 July if you are starting your studies in September**. Please note: A few pre-master's and master's programmes offer a start in February. If you are applying to start your studies in February, we have to send the application to the IND

before 1 December. You can find out if your study programme offers a start in February on the admission requirements web page of that programme (<u>pre-master's</u>, <u>master's</u>).

Therefore, we **strongly recommend** that you reconsider applying for this study programme if you are not sure that you will meet the following requirements before 1 July/1 December (if applicable in your situation):

- Having remedied all subject and/or language deficiencies (if applicable)
- Having qualified for admission to your study programme, including being selected (if applicable to your study programme) AND
- Having paid the tuition fee for your study programme

Dutch university diploma

If you have a Dutch university degree with a written thesis of at least 8 ECTS, you are eligible for admission. The following documents are required for your application:

Grades transcript of your bachelor's programme

Upload an official grades transcript, signed and stamped by your university, plus a translation if the original is not in English.

Copy of your diploma (if obtained)

Only if you already have completed your bachelor's degree

Curriculum vitae

International diploma

To be eligible for admission to this master's programme, you need to have a bachelor's or master's degree that is equivalent to a Dutch university bachelor's degree and a written thesis of at least 8 ECTS. The Board of Admissions will determine the equivalence of your degree*. Applicants with a degree that is not equivalent to a Dutch university degree or who do not have a written 8 ECTS thesis will receive instructions from the Board of Admissions on how to compensate for this deficiency.

* To assess if your bachelor's or master's degree is equivalent to a Dutch university bachelor's or master's degree, the Nuffic comparison tool for education systems on www.nuffic.nl will be used. If there is no clear comparison possible, Nuffic will assess your degree separately. The verdict of Nuffic is final.

Dutch HBO diploma + Academic Minor or SBM programme

If you have successfully finished the Academic Minor or ICT preparatory programme at Zuyd University of Applied Sciences, or SBM-programme at Breda University of Applied Sciences, you

meet the admission requirements for this master's programme. The following documents are required for your application:

Dutch HBO diploma

Good to know

Over the years, we have learned that there are a few factors that are important in determining whether a student is able to successfully complete the master's programme:

- English language skills
- Basic proficiency in research skills (from your previous education)
- High motivation and full-time dedication to the programme

How do we assess your application?

When you want to apply or are applying to this study programme, it is useful to know how we assess your application. You can find more information about this here.

The admissions decision is based on the documents provided by you. Selection will take place on the basis of your quality and suitability. In this respect your motivation, prior qualifications as well as your professional experience are important. The English language requirements and the requirement that you need to have obtained a bachelor's degree at the start of the programme in September (regardless of relevance) are strictly applied.

No one will be admitted to this programme directly. In some cases, the Board of Admission may request additional documents or an interview. The decision will always be made on a case-by-case basis to determine whether there are sufficient grounds for admission.

You will receive the decision on your admissibility within 4 weeks after your application has been submitted to the Board of Admissions.

Note: only complete applications will be assessed. We therefore recommend that you adhere to the deadlines provided in the table under 'Important deadlines for application to this study programme' on this page.
