What is Arts and Culture?

- 40 hour, full-time programme
- Taught in English, with possibility to write in Dutch





Problem-Based Learning

- Small group tutorials

- Writing trajectory in English or Dutch







International Classroom

- 75 % of the first-year students come from abroad
- 26 nationalities in the first year
- 42 % of the teachers are international



- Discourse analysis I II
- Research & Writing track
 - also offered in Dutch







What does an average week look like?



Typical Course Structure

- 8 weeks (7 of classes, final exam week)
- 2 tutorials / week
- 1 or 2 lectures / week
- 1 skills meeting / week
- mentor meetings
- Types of exams: written exam open essay questions, research papers, presentations
