

## Teaching and learning methodology

- Problem-Based Learning (PBL)
- Interdisciplinary, thematic modules
- Tutor groups, skills training and supporting lectures
- Up to 15 students per group,
   supervised by a tutor
- 10-12 regular contact hours
- Papers and presentations
- Conducting research







## **Education – An academic year consists of:**

- 8 week blocks
- 2 courses per block
- PBL sessions(4 hours weekly)
- Lectures
  (4-6 hours weekly)
- Skills(2 hours weekly)



In total: 10-12 hours a week at the university
