# Bachelor's programmes

## European Public Health - fall and spring

Study public health and healthcare in Europe. This unique programme works on preventing disease and promoting health at the intersection of science, politics and law.

Incoming exchange students can register for a number of courses from the first, second and third year.

## Health Sciences - spring

Combine biological, psychological, behavioral, environmental and health related factors. Health Sciences students work on complex healthcare and societal issues from a broad background.

Incoming exchange students can register for four different minor tracks: Biology and Health, Mental Health Sciences, Policy, Management and Evaluation of Health Care and Prevention and Health.

### Biomedical Sciences - fall

Immerse yourself in how the body works and in medication and diseases. Biomedical Sciences explores the relationship between human beings and their environment: from molecules, to genes, to cells and organs, to individuals and to entire populations.

Incoming exchange students can register for a number of third year courses from the Biomedical Sciences programme.

# Master's programmes

For incoming master's students, we offer a number of courses in different programmes, such as: Biomedical Sciences, Governance and Leadership in European Public Health, Health Education and Promotion, Human Movement Sciences, Healthcare Policy, Innovation and Management and Epidemiology.
