On April 9th, more than 40 CAPHRI PhD candidates participated in an engaging online workshop led by Jet from ElroyCOM. The session focused on how to increase the impact of your research by communicating effectively with non-expert audiences. Participants worked on clarifying their core message, learned why explaining why their research matters is more important than just how it is done, and practiced refining their pitch using the principles of the 6 C's. Through peer interviews, attendees helped each other identify the most compelling elements of their stories, enhancing them with metaphors and memorable one-liners.

The workshop was both informative and interactive, and we look forward to welcoming you to the next event—the Academic Kick-off meeting—which will also have an informal component. We hope to see you there!



Sjim Romme wins CaRe Award 2025

CAPHRI news

Sjim Romme, PhD alumnus of SHE and CAPHRI, has been awarded the prestigious CaRe Award 2025 for best thesis. Selected from a competitive pool of over 250 candidates and eight nominated PhD theses, the award recognises Romme's innovative research on patient involvement in healthcare education and quality improvement.

His dissertation, "Patient Involvement as a Two-Way Street," explores how patients can actively contribute to the education of healthcare professionals and the enhancement of care quality. Romme's work focuses on the Mens Achter de Patiënt module and the Patient As a Person Academy (PAP-Academy), both pivotal in advancing person-centered care. His research demonstrates how meaningful patient involvement enriches healthcare education and improves care outcomes, highlighting the collaborative efforts of scholars, students, and experts by experience.

Reflecting on the award, Sjim Romme stated: "It is an honour to receive this award and present our work to a group of like-minded scholars. The award results from a group effort of scholars, students and experts by experience. Our work is far from done, and we continue our effort to realize more meaningful patient involvement in education and healthcare."

Congratulations are also extended to Veja Widdershoven for her well-deserved nomination, recognizing her important research on addressing vaccine hesitancy through effective, personcentered communication strategies.

As a Maastricht University researcher, your research outputs are showcased on the <u>Maastricht University | MUMC+ Research Information portal</u>. This portal presents all public research information that is entered in UM's research information system Pure.

In Pure, new UM publications are automatically imported from various online sources. To complete your research overview, you can also add other output types, for example activities, datasets, non-UM publications, press/media contributions and prizes.

Share your output

By actively sharing your research output on social media platforms, you can create backlinks and engagement metrics that enhance search engine optimization (SEO). This signals relevance and authority to search engines like Google, driving traffic to your Pure researcher profile and boosting its visibility. You can easily share your output by using the social media bar on the right side in the portal page of the individual output.


