Measuring the true impact of Epilepsy

On International Epilepsy Day, February 10th, we highlighted the far-reaching effects of epilepsy beyond seizures. This condition affects daily life, well-being, and financial stability for millions worldwide.

Darin Elabbasy, PhD student (VHC), is conducting ground-breaking research into the societal and economic burdens of Drug-Resistant Epilepsy (DRE). Her work focuses on understanding these challenges to improve care and quality of life for patients and their families.

This research is part of the AIM@EPILEPSY project, funded by the Dutch Research Council (NWO). The project is a collaborative effort involving partners such as Maastricht UMC+ Kempenhaeghe, EpilepsieNL, TU Delft, and Clinical Neuro-Science projects (CNSp).
