The number of networks in healthcare is growing. In these networks, healthcare providers and organisations collaborate with each other.

This is sorely needed, as people increasingly require different types of care simultaneously. However, measuring whether these networks are effective proves challenging and is therefore rarely substantiated. And even when people feel a network is ineffective, they continue with it. These conclusions are drawn by PhD candidate Robin Peeters (VHC) in her latest research published in Social Science and Medicine.

The Living Lab in Ageing & Long-term Care (AWO-L) has been at the forefront of reablement research since 2014, establishing a learning network in 2023 to facilitate knowledge sharing and collaboration.

In a recently released podcast, PhD candidate Lise Buma (HSR) offers valuable insights into the complexities of reablement. Alongside colleagues from Cicero Zorggroep and Woonzorggroep Samen, Buma bridges the gap between academic research and practical implementation, providing a comprehensive understanding of how reablement strategies can effectively support older individuals in maintaining their independence and improving their quality of life.
