anonymization requirements.

The CAPHRI Science Commission will assess submissions based on scientific quality and societal relevance. Top-ranked abstracts (4-8 per Research Line) will be selected for poster development and presentation.

Jesper Biesmans wins award at ICT & Health Congress

We are pleased to announce that PhD candidate Jesper Biesmans, (ATLC), has recently been recognized for his outstanding work at the ICT & Health Congress in Maastricht. Jesper secured third place in the 'Pitch Your Passion' poster competition with his project DEDICATED (Desired Dementia Care Towards End of Life).

The DEDICATED project aims to enhance the quality of palliative care for people with dementia by empowering healthcare professionals. Through specialized training and tools, the project helps professionals to:

- 1. Familiarize themselves with dementia patients
- 2. Improve communication about palliative care wishes and needs
- 3. Facilitate smooth transitions from home to nursing home care

Jesper's research has shown that DEDICATED ambassadors—healthcare professionals who have completed the training—report improved ability to initiate proactive discussions about patients' wishes, leading to more person-centered care. The project is now being implemented across the Netherlands and in the Caribbean Netherlands.

When asked about his success, Jesper offered this golden tip for making an effective pitch:
"Grab the attention of your listeners by expressing the necessity of your study and present your work with full enthusiasm!"



Beyond bullet points: Senne Wijnen's strategy for memorable presentations

At the recent CAPI Symposium, PhD candidate Senne Wijnen (PHPC) presented findings from the PRIME study on post-COVID-19 condition (PCC), also known as long COVID. This global health concern significantly impacts physical, mental, and social well-being. The study revealed that adults with PCC perceived higher stress levels compared to those without PCC. Various environmental and individual factors, such as work absenteeism, less social support, loneliness, and post-exertional malaise, were associated with perceived stress in both groups. Nearly all stress-associated factors were more prevalent in adults with PCC, highlighting the impact of PCC.

Sharing important research findings requires effective communication. Inspired in part by her recent presentation at the CAPI Symposium and drawing from her experience as a PhD candidate, Senne Wijnen shares her key advice for delivering engaging and effective presentations.

"When preparing a presentation, prioritize visual engagement by using minimal text on slides. This keeps your audience focused on your spoken words rather than reading from the screen. For inspiration, explore creative design ideas and animations on social media from presentation experts. To leave a lasting impression, start and end your presentation with impact—whether through a strong statement, surprising fact, or thought-provoking question. Deliver it with deliberate variations in pace and well-placed pauses to emphasize key points."


Navigating Research Ethics
