## From Session Chair to Scientific Pitch: A Successful DSR Autumn Meeting for CAPHRI's Marius Smits

Marius Smits (FPR) recently played a significant role in the Dutch Society for Rheumatology (DSR) Najaarsdagen (Autumn Meeting) in Arnhem.


Marius was honoured with the opportunity to serve as a session chair during the two-day event, contributing to the smooth running and intellectual engagement of the meeting. In addition to his role as chair, he successfully presented a "pitch" of their team's recent study.

The presented research focused on the crucial topic of predicting residual disease in axial spondyloarthritis. This work, which aims to improve prognostic capabilities in rheumatology, was highlighted during the congress, underscoring the relevance and impact of research conducted within the CAPHRI school.

Marius described the experience as an "honour" and looked back on "two incredibly inspiring days," noting the value of connecting with fellow experts

and sharing important findings with the wider rheumatology community.

## Molecular Insights and Networking: Anne Verkerk Showcases Antibiotic Resistance Research

Anne Verkerk (HISP) recently gained valuable international experience by attending her first international conference, the IMMEM XIV 2025 meeting in Porto.

The conference, which focused on molecular microbiology and human health, provided Anne with a prime opportunity to connect with experts and immerse herself in cutting-edge science. She highlighted learning about exciting new developments in molecular typing and particularly enjoyed the insights shared during the bioinformatics session.

The true highlight, however, was presenting her work during the poster session. Anne showcased her ongoing and future research exploring antimicrobial-resistant bacteria in the clinical environment, the environmental reservoirs pose to patients, and the potential for surveillance strategies. This session allowed her to network and meet others working in the field, fostering crucial scientific connections.

Looking ahead, Anne expressed enthusiasm for the final two years of her PhD journey, energized by the knowledge and contacts gained at IMMEM XIV.



## Key Findings on Pain and Aging by Saskia Truijen

CAPHRI PhD candidate Saskia Truijen (FPR) is celebrating the culmination of her intensive three-year research project in Rheumatology, which included setting up her own study and collecting data from 450 participants for the STAR study.

Her research on Musculoskeletal Pain (MSP) in The Maastricht Study offers intriguing cross-sectional findings: MSP prevalence does not continue to rise after age 60, and older adults report a less negative mental health impact from pain than middle-aged adults.

Initial cross-sectional results from the STAR study on rheumatoid arthritis (RA) and aging also suggest that while older RA patients have lower physical function, their rate of functional decline with age appears comparable to healthy peers. This outcome may indicate current treatments are successfully limiting functional loss.

These relevant findings emphasize the need for a general, yet adaptable, approach to chronic pain management across age groups. Saskia is now preparing to share her results internationally with a trip to Chicago later this month.

## Social Context and Intervention Strategies: Sophie Jooren Tackles the Dilemma of Outdoor Tobacco Control

We've all accepted that lighting up indoors is a nogo—even on university campuses. But step outside, and enforcing those same smoke-free rules gets complicated. Why is compliance so tricky when smokers are outside?

CAPHRI PhD candidate Sophie Jooren (PHPC) tackled this exact question. Using her background in anthropology and a healthy dose of curiosity about human behaviour, Sophie conducted a realist review to figure out the underlying mechanisms of compliance (or non-compliance) with outdoor tobacco policies in the Netherlands.

Her research, funded by ZonMw, found that success boils down to three core factors: clear communication, accessible support to quit smoking, and the public's acceptance of the policy. For policymakers, this means practical steps are crucial—think removing those sneaky ashtrays still lingering in smoke-free zones, and making sure policy reminders are regular. The national campaign 'The Smoke-free Generation', which focuses on children growing up smoke-free, is a prime example of effective communication.

Conversely, non-compliance is often driven by factors like addiction, feeling stigma, and a lack of faith in the policy's effectiveness or enforcement. Sophie's findings provide a roadmap for regional public health services to create smarter, more effective outdoor interventions. Want the full breakdown of her research and policy tips?
