

## MAASTRICHT Programme for Double Degree students from BOCCONI

Bocconi students in the Double Degree programme have to fulfill the requirements as applicable for the master's programme European Law School (ELS). The option to fill in 6 elective credits with an approved study abroad period is not open to the Double Degree students.

The Maastricht courses will have to contribute to the integrated Bocconi degree (Laurea Magistrale in Giurisprudenza) as well, so be sure that you have a valid learning agreement!

The 2023/24 ELS master's programme is included below. You will have to enroll for each period separately. You need to choose the general programme or chose the specialisation European Business Law or the specialisation European Public Law. Make sure that your course combination meets the requirements mentioned below.
