











Finding a job after finishing FASoS

→ Unemployment of FASoS graduates fluctuates strongly with business cycle




Unemployment compared

 Unemployment rates compared to other arts and culture programmes at Dutch universities






Finding a job within field






Gross monthly income






Being satisfied with job


