Descriptive summary of the project (main goal(s), main activities, main results)

The main purpose of this project was to improve parts of the basic S1 law curriculum (the Bachelor degree in law) offered by the Faculty of Law of Universitas Gadja Mada (UGM) in Yokjakarta, one of Indonesia's leading universities.

In this cooperation between the Faculties of Law of Gadjah Mada University and Maastricht University the legal education offered by FL UGM was strengthened in many ways.

The project focused specifically on parts of the S1 program, the elective courses for S1 law students and the international undergraduate program (IUP) in Law which is offered in English.

Improvements were introduced:

-by training of UGM Faculty of Law staff, both in training sessions and workshops on the spot and by offering exposure and tailor-made training in the Netherlands;

-by a series of workshops to upgrade actual knowledge on important themes in law, offered by UM staff in Yokjakarta;

-by introducing and implementing new learning methodologies, notably problembased learning;

-by (re)developing new course materials that are case-based for many courses offered in the S1 curriculum;

-by developing skills training for law students;

-by providing training in general English and in legal English.

In the framework of the project a book on legal skills training with contributions from both UM and UGM staff was published in Indonesia (in Bahasa Indonesia); the first publication of its kind in Indonesia.
