General requirements: previous education

This programme is designed for highly educated professionals (computer scientists, lawyers, policy makers) with several years of professional experience in and/or affinity with issues in the field of privacy, data protection and cybersecurity.

You must fulfil the following conditions to be admitted to the programme:

You have completed one of the study programmes below

- University master's or bachelor's degree in law or related fields such as economics, political science or international relations
- University master's or bachelor's degree in business or related studies
- University master's or bachelor's degree in computer science or a related field

Additional requirements

 Excellent command of English (IELTS overall score of 6.5 with a minimum of 6.5 for writing or an overall score of 7 is required), following Maastricht University's language policy 2018-2021

- Professional experience that demonstrates prior knowledge in law and computer science, or at least in one of the two areas
- Alternatively, in case of lack of professional experience, you must demonstrate excellent grades in the previous academic programmes and a strong motivation to follow the programme

Documents required for application process

During the application process for this study programme, you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare.

Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

A recent portrait picture

This picture must satisfy certain requirements.

A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card

Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.

A copy of your most recent certified grades transcript and a copy of your certified diploma if you have obtained it. If you have not graduated yet, you can upload your official grades transcript from your bachelor's programme

- Letter of motivation
- Copy of your language test with sufficient results (if applicable)

- Curriculum Vitae
- Documentation proving professional experience and/or academic merit

Please note: Only complete registrations will be taken into consideration. All documents must be in **Dutch**, **English** or **German**.

How do we assess your application?

The selection process will be conducted by the Admissions Board consisting of at least 3 members of Maastricht University affiliated with the programme.

The quality of your application will be evaluated following the order of criteria outlined in Art. 24 EER. Professional experience demonstrating prior knowledge of the areas listed above will be a key factor in your assessment. In case you have no or limited professional experience, the Board of Admissions will prioritise academic merit and your motivation to follow the programme.
