Note: the United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland) left the European Union on 31 January 2020. The Withdrawal Agreement states that students who hold the British nationality and were already living in the Netherlands with a BRP-registration before 1 January 2021, are allowed to continue paying the statutory tuition fees as long as they continue to live in the Netherlands with that BRP-registration. British nationals who were already living in the Netherlands before 1 January 2021 and are only starting their studies after 31 December 2020 are also eligible for the statutory tuition fees, provided they have not completed a bachelor's or master's degree in the Netherlands already. To be equally eligible for the statutory tuition fee beyond 1 September 2021, these students also need to submit a copy of their residence permit according to the Withdrawal Agreement. They should send a copy of the front and back of that card to visa@maastrichtuniversity.nl and mention their student ID-number.

British nationals who moved to the Netherlands to study (and reside) after 1 January 2021, are designated as non-EU/EEA nationals. These students require a general residence permit (algemene verblijfsvergunning) for the purpose of study and need to pay the institutional tuition fees.



- Halving statutory tuition fees for first-year bachelor's students

Bachelor's students, who have not previously been registered at a Dutch institute for higher professional education (hbo) or a Dutch university and who are eligible for statutory tuition fees, pay a halved rate in the first year of their study. The Dutch government contributes the difference to the university. The right of first-year bachelor's students to halved statutory tuition fees, applies once for a consecutive period of 12 months. Master's students are not eligible for a halving of the statutory tuition fees.
