## Important deadlines for this study programme

*Applicable when starting on 1 September 2022*

If your file is not completed before the deadline your application will not be considered.</i>
<b>Up to and including 1 May 2022, 23:59 CET</b>	Deadline for completing the entire application process for <b>EU/EEA</b> applicants

## General requirements: prior qualifications

The admission requirements for academic year 2022/23 for the bachelor's programme in European Law School depend on your prior qualifications. All applicants should meet the general requirements. Please check below whether additional requirements apply to you.

## Prospective students with a Dutch diploma

If you have one of the diplomas stated below then, in principle, you are directly admissible:

- Dutch VWO diploma
- HBO or OU propaedeutic diploma
- HBO diploma

## Prospective students with a non-Dutch diploma

If you have a non-Dutch diploma that is equivalent to the Dutch VWO diploma you are, in principle, admissible to this programme. Check if this applies for your diploma.

If your diploma is not included in this list, it must be evaluated by UM first.

## Prospective students who do not meet the requirements

### Entrance exam, Colloquium Doctum

If you do not have the required diploma, or do not meet the additional requirements, you can still qualify by passing an entrance exam (the so called Colloquium Doctum).

If you pass the Colloquium Doctum and submit the requested proof of language proficiency, you will qualify for enrolment in the bachelor's programme.

## Foundation Programme

### International prospective students who do not meet the admission requirements: Foundation Programme

If you are an international prospective student, and you do not meet the admission requirements, then you may be eligible for the Foundation Programme. The Foundation Programme will provide you with intensive training in academic skills, courses relevant to your chosen bachelor's programme, and English language skills (depending on your level).

After successfully completing the Foundation Programme, you will be eligible for admission to this bachelor's programme. Additionally, the Foundation Programme offers support outside of the classroom and organises events that will help you make new friends and adjust to life in the Netherlands and at Maastricht University.

**A copy of your most recent grades transcript and a copy of your diploma** if you have obtained it

### Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

- **Result of your language test, with a satisfactory result** (if applicable)
- **Proof of additional courses or tests in the required subjects** (if applicable)
- **A request for exemption** (if applicable)  
*Applicants who are of the opinion that they have already obtained comparable subjects earlier can request exemptions. The subjects must be equivalent in terms of content, study hours and level. A request for exemptions has to be submitted to the examinations committee of this programme by you. Your request will only be considered if you have already registered. ## How do we assess your application?

### Matching Procedure

The selection committee will evaluate your completed questionnaire. You will subsequently receive feedback and a study advice within six weeks.

## **Binding Study Advice**
