Admission requirements

On this page you will find important details of the application process (such as deadlines, admission requirements, required documents and application assessment) for the master's programme in European Studies (Research) for *academic year 2022-2023*.

For the research master's programme in European Studies, enrolment is based on your quality and suitability. For this your motivation, prior qualifications and your (professional) experience are important.

Important deadlines for application for this study programme

Applicable when starting on 1 September 2022

When you want to apply or are applying for this study programme, it is important that you inform yourself of the deadlines that you need to meet. The important deadlines when applying for this study programme are provided in the table below.

Note: if you are viewing this webpage on your phone, we recommend that you use landscape mode.

Find out if you can apply for a <u>scholarship</u> or <u>financial aid</u>. Deadlines for scholarships are often earlier than the dates mentioned above.

In Studielink, you need to choose the starting moment. Please make sure to select **September 2022** in the pulldown-menu, so that you will apply for the start of the next academic year.

General requirements: prior qualifications

The admission requirements for academic year 2022/23 for the master's in European Studies (Research) depend on your prior qualifications. Please check below which requirements apply to you.

Graduates from a relevant university bachelor's programme

You are eligible for admission if you have graduated in a relevant bachelor's degree in: European Studies, Social or Political Science, History, Economics, International Relations, Law, or a similar

field. Provided that the Bachelor's programme included sufficient Europe-oriented component.

Additional requirements

You must have strong academic abilities, not be afraid to work hard, and have a keen interest to pursue research in the field of European integration.

Please note: There are additional requirements when applying for the double degree track (see below).

Language requirements for English-language master's programmes

As English is the language of instruction in this study programme, it is essential that your English language skills are good enough for you to undertake intensive and challenging academic courses that are taught and examined in English.

Prospective students who received their prior education in a non-EU/EEA country (handling fee)

Prospective students applying for this study programme who received their prior education in a non-EU/EEA country will have to pay a handling fee. More information on this handling fee and how to arrange this payment can be found on the <u>Handling fee page</u>.

Additional requirements when applying for the Double Degree programme

If you wish to enrol in the double degree programme, you need to indicate this in your motivation letter when applying (please explicitly mention if you intend to pursue a double degree and briefly explain why). Your application will be assessed by the Board of Admission of Maastricht University and, independently, by the Board of Admission of the University of Cologne. Please bear in mind that the University of Cologne has specific entry requirements and selection criteria (see website of the University of Cologne).

All candidates need to submit their application at Maastricht University. Maastricht University and the University of Cologne both revise the applications, making sure that candidates fulfil the entry requirements of both universities and pass the selection procedure successfully.

If you are accepted to the double degree option, and applied with a non-German bachelor's degree, it is under the condition that you send certified copies of your documents to uni-assist for evaluation during your first year of studies. You will also have to pay the corresponding handling fee (currently €75; subject to change).

If your application to the Master European Studies (Research) is accepted at Maastricht University but rejected for the double degree option with the University of Cologne, you can study the European Studies Master's programme at Maastricht University with one of the other options offered (internship or study abroad option).

Tuition fees for the Double Degree Programme

Year one

In year one you have to pay the regular UM tuition fee. You are enrolled at UM but also at the University of Cologne, though no tuition fees are charged in Cologne.

However, all students of the University of Cologne must pay a social contribution of approximately € 285 per semester. This is not a tuition fee but a solidarity payment. It also includes the cost of the semester ticket for free public transportation.

If you are not interested in using the German's transportation system, you can get back a part of the money for the semester ticket (approximately €185 euros per semester). The request for the reimbursement of the money for the semester ticket is only in the first year and has to be done within four weeks after the beginning of the lectures of the University of Cologne.

Year two

In year two you have to pay the regular tuition fee at University of Cologne. You are enrolled at the University of Cologne. You do not need to register at Maastricht University at the start of the academic year. However, in order to graduate at Maastricht University, you need to register for the month of August only and will have to pay 1/12 of the applicable tuition fee.

The admissions office of the UM will contact you in May of your second year to inform you on the registration procedure at UM.

Documents required for application process

During the application process for this study programme you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare.

Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

- A recent passport picture* The passport picture must satisfy certain <u>requirements</u>.
- A copy of your passport or your EU/EEA identity card* Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'. Your passport must be valid on 1 September 2022.
- A copy of your most recent certified grades transcript and a copy of your certified bachelor's or master's diploma if you have obtained it *If you have not graduated yet, you can upload your official grades transcript from your bachelor's or master's programme.*
- Your Curiculum Vitae Please list your education, relevant extracurricular activities and internship/professional experience.
- A motivation letter
 Address the following topics:
- 1. Why are you interested in the Research Master European Studies at Maastricht University?
- 2. Which of the following three themes are you most interested in: 1) the history of the European integration process; 2) governance and representation in the European Union; 3) Europe and the world (<u>see here for more information</u>). Please give examples of research questions that appeal to you within these themes.

- 3. What kind of training have you had in research methods, so far? Are you most experienced and/or interested in qualitative or quantitative research methods?
- 4. What are your plans in year 2 of the Research Master? Please indicate if you are interested in the double degree programme (with Cologne University), the research internship or the exchange abroad, and briefly explain why.

• Two writing samples

Provide proof of sufficient academic writing/research skills. The Admission Board asks the applicant to submit two samples of academic writing, such academic papers or a thesis from a university bachelor's programme (written by the applicant in English language). The writing samples should reflect your research experience and academic writing skills. Alternatively, in case the applicant does not have suitable academic papers to submit (e.g. because they are not in the language of the chosen programme), it is also possible to write a 2.500-word essay on a topic specified by the Admission Board. *As a UM student it is not necessary to upload the above mentioned documents in the MyUM portal. However, if your passport will not be valid on 1 September 2022, then you still have to upload a copy of your passport.

Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

Proof of English language proficiency

Answer the questions concerning language requirements under 'Language requirements for English-language master's programmes' on this webpage to find out what are the requirements. The outcome of your answers will indicate which documents you should send to prove your proficiency.

Upload the requested documents via the <u>MyUM portal</u>.

Only complete applications will be reviewed. All documents should be in English.

How do we assess your application?

When you want to apply or are applying to for this study programme, it is useful to know how we assess your application. You can find more information about this here.

For the research master's programme in European Studies, enrolment is based on your quality and suitability. For this your motivation, prior qualifications and your (professional) experience are important. You provide proof of this by uploading several documents. All complete application files will be assessed by the UM.

An interview may also be part of the selection procedure for admission to this programme. Selection interviews will take part in the period from April throughout June.

Message about admission

Based on the documents you have submitted and the admission procedure for your chosen programme, the UM decides on whether to admit you. Once UM has made a decision on your admissibility, you will be informed about this by email.

Enrolment before completing prior education (zachte knip regulation)

To help students who have experienced delays in their studies due to COVID-19, we have put the 'zachte knip' regulation in place. This regulation means that you can enrol in your next education programme before you have completed your prior education. Were you, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, unable to earn enough credits in the academic year 2021-22 to complete your prior education on time? In that case, you will be given the opportunity to conditionally start your next education programme at UM under certain terms in academic year 2022-23 (study start in September or February).

When are you eligible for the 'zachte knip'?

Would you like to go from:

- a bachelor's programme to a UM pre-master's or master's programme,
- a pre-master's or 'schakel' programme to a UM master's programme, or
- an HBO propedeuse (first-year diploma at a university of applied sciences) to a UM bachelor's programme?

Exceptions to the rule

As an exception to the standard, some programmes of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences apply an adjusted standard to admit students on the basis of the 'zachte knip': FASoS students may miss a maximum of 12 ECTS from the last two years of their bachelor's programme. In addition, students of the UM bachelor Arts and Culture may miss a maximum of 16 ECTS as the thesis of this programme consists of 16 ECTS. Students of the UM bachelor Digital Society may miss a maximum of 17 ECTS as the thesis of this programme consists of 16 ECTS.

How and when do you file an application for the 'zachte knip'?
