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Admission requirements

On this page you will find important details of the application process (such as deadlines, admission requirements, required documents and application assessment) for the bachelor's programme in Medicine for *academic year 2022-2023*.

Medicine is a programme with (additional) admission requirements. Sitting an examination in a certain subject does not mean that you automatically satisfy the statutory prior education and/or additional subject requirements. There are strict requirements concerning number of study hours, content, difficulty of the material dealt with, and examinations completed.

Note: all candidates must submit a portfolio, an addendum to the portfolio and a homework assignment when applying. For more information see the paragraph 'Documents required for application process' on this page.

Selection

Medicine is an educational fixus programme with selection, not everybody who is admissible will also receive a training place. Please read all the information on this page carefully.

The total intake capacity at Maastricht is determined each year; in 2021/22 it was 366 students. Of the available training places, 50 are reserved for the [Physician-Clinical Investigator Master's programme](#) (A-KO taught in Dutch) and a maximum of 60 places are available for the [International Track in Medicine \(ITM\)](#). The remaining places are intended for the Dutch bachelor's programme in Medicine.

General requirements: prior qualifications

The admission requirements for academic year 2022-2023 for the bachelor's programme in Medicine depend among other things on your prior qualifications. Please check below which requirements apply to you.

Prospective students with a Dutch diploma

If you possess one of the diplomas stated below then, in principle, you are directly admissible.

- A new-style VWO diploma with the **profile Natuur en Gezondheid** (Science and Health) **with profile subject Physics**
- A new-style VWO diploma with the **profile Natuur en Techniek** (Science and Engineering) **with profile subject Biology**
- An OU (Open University) propaedeutic diploma, hbo propaedeutic diploma, hbo degree diploma, university propaedeutic diploma or university degree diploma. Sufficient knowledge at vwo level of the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics is required.

An old-style VWO diploma no longer gives the right to admission.

Prospective students with a non-Dutch diploma

If you have a non-Dutch diploma that is equivalent to the Dutch VWO diploma (Dutch pre-university education), you are in principle admissible to this programme. Check the list of diplomas equivalent to the Dutch VWO diploma to see if this applies to your diploma.

If your diploma is not included in this list, Maastricht University (UM) will first determine whether you are admissible.

Please note: this step will take extra time so it is important to apply early, preferably before 1 November 2021.

Please be aware that if you register after 1 November 2020, you are taking the risk that the assessment of your admissibility and/or eliminating one (or more) of your deficiencies will not be completed on time. As a result, you may not be able to start the programme in the academic year 2022/23.

Additional requirements subject package future students with a non-Dutch diploma

- **German 'Zeugnis der allgemeinen Hochschulreife':** Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry: As 'Grundkurs' up until and including the final year. Biology as "Leistungsfach"
- **Belgian Diploma of Secondary Education:** One of the tracks: Greek-Sciences, Latin-Sciences, Modern Languages-Sciences, Sciences-Mathematics
- **International Baccalaureate from Geneva:** Mathematics Analysis and Approaches HL or SL or Mathematics Applications and Interpretation HL; Physics and Chemistry SL or HL; Biology HL
- **European Baccalaureate:** Mathematics: written or oral exams, at least 3 hours/week in the last 2 years; Physics and Chemistry: written or oral exams; Biology: Written or oral exams, at least 4 hours/week the last 2 years

- **British A/AS levels, (I) GCSEs and/or AICE:** Mathematics and Physics: GCE A or AS level; Chemistry and Biology: GCE A-level

[Additional subject requirement pertaining to non-Dutch entry qualifications 2022-2023](#)

If your diploma or degree differs from those listed above, the UM will assess whether you can demonstrate sufficient knowledge of the four compulsory subjects (Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics, and Biology) and therefore qualify for an exemption (*sufficiëntieverklaring*) for these subjects on an individual basis. This assessment is based on the attainment aims for final examination in Dutch pre-university education (VWO) in the relevant subject and the national agreements made within the Central Commissions Pre-examination (in Dutch: CCVX). The assessment takes extra time, so be sure to register for it at the earliest possible date, preferably before **1 November 2021**.

Bear in mind that if you register after 1 November 2021, you are at risk that the assessment of your admissibility and/or the definitive schedule for eliminating one (or more) of your deficiencies will not be completed on time. As a result, you may not be able to begin the programme in the 2022/23 academic year.

Note! Sitting an examination in a certain subject does not mean that you automatically satisfy the prior and/or additional education requirements. There are strict requirements concerning number of study hours, content, difficulty of the material dealt with, and examinations completed.

Prospective students who do not meet the prior and/or additional education requirements

If you already have or will be awarded a Dutch pre-university (VWO) or equivalent diploma but do not satisfy the additional requirements for the subjects Biology, Physics, Chemistry and/or Mathematics, you must sit an additional examination. If you must sit an additional examination in Mathematics you can choose mathematics A or B. These additional examinations are organised by [CCVX](#) (Central Commissions Pre-examination, in Dutch: Centrale Commissies Voortentamens) and/or [Boswell/Bèta](#). You can sit the examinations in either English or Dutch.

Note! If you wish to begin your programme in the 2022/23 academic year, you must have submitted a certificate for all compulsory subjects by 15 January 2022, 16:00 CET **OR** include a complete and detailed plan stating how you will obtain the relevant certificate/certificates on time in your portfolio (deadline 21 January 2022, 16:00 CET) as well as in the definitive schedule for satisfying the (additional) statutory admission requirements (deadline 25 March 2022, 16:00 CET).

Secondary school students who will receive their first Dutch pre-university (VWO) or one of the explicitly above mentioned equivalent diplomas with required examination courses mid-2021 are not considered deficient. In case of a diploma that will be assessed on individual basis of the UM one or more subject deficiencies may exist. Please have your diploma and subject combination/profile checked in time.

Applying for sufficiency check

For every subject for which a sufficiency check is required, you must compile a dossier for assessment of admissibility by the Colloquium Doctum Committee. Please upload the dossier in the My UM portal.

Entrance exam, Colloquium Doctum

If you are inadmissible because you do not have the required diploma and you are older than 21 years of age at the start of the programme, you may be eligible to sit a special entrance exam, the so-called Colloquium Doctum.

The Faculty of Health, Medicine and Life Sciences (FHML) at UM does not arrange Colloquium Doctum examinations but can issue a Colloquium Doctum certificate. To qualify for a Colloquium Doctum certificate, you must demonstrate proficiency in English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics at Dutch pre-university (VWO) level.

Upon submission of proof of proficiency in these subjects (via tbo-ba-gen@maastrichtuniversity.nl), you will obtain a Colloquium Doctum certificate. With this certificate you can prove that you meet the prior and/or additional education requirements for the bachelor of Medicine at UM.

Additional requirements

Language requirements for the International Track in Medicine (ITM)

Placement in the English-taught International Track in Medicine (ITM) requires proof of a good command of the English language.

Prospective students who received their prior education in a non-EU/EEA country (handling fee)

Documents required for application process

During the application process for this study programme, you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare.

Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

- **A recent passport picture**
The passport picture must satisfy certain [requirements](#).
- **A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card**
Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.
- **A copy of your most recent list of grades and a copy of your diploma** if you have obtained it.

- **The online portfolio** (round 1 selection procedure)
The portfolio that you fill in online consists of a pre-structured cv and a number of questions in answer to which you explain your decision to apply for a place in the bachelor's programme in Medicine / the International Track in Medicine (ITM) at the UM. The online portfolio is available from 3 December 2021 on via a link in your email, and must be completed in full and correctly before 21 January 2022, 16:00 CET (Central European Time).

*Candidates who have registered in Studielink **before** 1 December 2021 and have a notice issued by UM Admissions at your disposal, indicating whether or not you fulfill the statutory prior and/or additional education requirements for admission to the bachelor's programme in Medicine will receive an email containing the link to the online portfolio on 3 December 2021.*

*Candidates who register in Studielink **after** 1 December 2021 and then receive a notice issued by UM Admissions at your disposal, indicating whether or not you fulfill the statutory prior and/or additional education requirements for admission to the bachelor's programme in Medicine, will receive an email with the link to the online portfolio in two to three working days after the notice issued by the UM Admissions. **Please also check your SPAM inbox!** If you have not yet received an email after five working days, please contact decsel-ba-gen@maastrichtuniversity.nl*

- **The addendum to the online portfolio**
Information about the addendum to the online portfolio will be available within the online portfolio itself. The addendum must be submitted within the online portfolio itself before 21 January 2022, 16:00 CET.
- **The homework assignment**
Information about the homework assignment will be available within the online portfolio itself. The homework assignment must be submitted within the online portfolio itself before 21 January 2022, 16:00 CET.

Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

- **Proof of your language proficiency in English**
Answer the questions concerning language requirements under 'Language requirements for the International Track in Medicine' on this webpage to find out if you need to provide additional documentation. The outcome of your answers will indicate what documents you can use to prove your proficiency.
- **Documents showing proficiency in the required subjects** (Maths, Physics, Chemistry, Biology)
If you are found to be deficient for one of the required subjects, you must demonstrate by means of a certificate that you have sufficient knowledge to remedy this deficiency.

If you qualify for a [sufficiency check](#), then you must, for every subject for which a sufficiency check is required, compile a dossier for assessment of admissibility by the Colloquium Doctum Committee.
- **The definitive schedule for timely satisfying the statutory prior education and/or additional subject requirements 2022**
- If you do not satisfy the prior subject requirements (yet), you have one or more deficiencies. If you have one or more deficiencies on 15 January 2022 at 16:00 CET, you must produce a detailed schedule showing that you will be able to satisfy all the admission requirements on time. The ['Definitive schedule for timely satisfying the statutory prior education and/or additional subject requirements on time 2022'](#) (hereafter: 'definitive schedule') consists of a number of questions about your schedule. After you have completed the form and attached

the necessary supporting documents/materials (or scans) providing evidence, you must convert the entire set to PDF format. Before you fill in the definitive schedule, please read the [accompanying instructions](#) carefully.

- The entire definitive schedule must be in our possession before 25 March 2022, 16:00 CET.

You must submit evidence that you satisfy all the statutory prior education and/or additional subject requirements 2022/23 by 16 July 2022, 16:00 CET at the latest. If you are unable to demonstrate that you have rectified any deficiencies by 16 July 2022, 16:00 CET at the latest, for example because your exam results will only be issued after 16 July 2022, then you must send an email to decsel-ba-gen@maastrichtuniversity.nl. Bear in mind that the organising institutes of the additional examinations ([CCVX](#) and [Boswell/Bèta](#)) have a maximum of 20 working days to make the result known. Therefore make sure you take your exam on time.

Please note:

Only **completed** applications will be considered.

All documents must be in **Dutch, English or German**.

Selection process

Round one

Round two

You will come to Maastricht on **19 February 2022** for a selection day. You will be asked to complete several assignments that test your (inter)personal and non-cognitive skills.

If applicable, the selection committee will assess your uploaded 'Definitive schedule for satisfying the statutory prior education and/or additional subject requirements on time'. For more information regarding the procedure of round 2 see the document below.

Assessment

Based on the selection procedure, the selection committee will produce a ranking. This ranking is submitted to Studielink. On **15 April 2022**, you will be informed about your ranking number. Studielink will begin to issue proofs of placements.

Please note: depending on the COVID-19 infections and measures, decisions can be taken to adjust the selection procedure. In case of changes, candidates will be informed appropriately.

Please note: receipt of a proof of placement cannot be considered as official Proof of Admission for the bachelor's in Medicine at Maastricht University (UM). UM will first check whether you satisfy all (additional) admission and registration requirements on time.

You must redeem your proof of placement in Studielink within two weeks. If you do not do so by the deadline, you will forfeit the place you have been offered.

Study advice at end of bachelor year 1

At the end of year 1 of the study programme, every student receives advice on whether or not to continue his/her study. This advice is not binding. However, students must obtain a predetermined amount of study credits to be admitted to the second year of the programme. The amount of credits that must be earned, is documented in the Education and Examination Regulations (EER) of each study programme.
