Admission requirements

On this page you will find important details of the application process (such as deadlines, admission requirements, required documents and application assessment) for the bachelor's programme in Psychology for *academic year* 2022-2023.

The bachelor's programme in Psychology is a fixus programme with <u>selection</u> by the educational institution. This means that you go through a selection process after applying. Not everybody who is admissible will also receive placement. The UM performs a pre-selection, afterwards Studielink takes care of the allocation procedure. Only a limited number of students can be admitted each year, 500 for the academic year 2022/23.

For the academic year 2022/23 all available places will be allocated by means of selection.

Important deadlines for application for this study programme

Applicable when starting on 1 September 2022

When you want to apply or are applying for this study programme, it is important that you inform yourself of the deadlines that you need to meet. The important deadlines when applying for this study programme are provided in the table below.

Please note: in Studielink you must directly make a choice between the Dutch (4501) and English (4501_T1) tracks. Switching tracks is not possible.

General requirements: prior qualifications

The admission requirements for academic year 2022/2023 for the bachelor's programme in Psychology depend on your prior qualifications. Please check below which requirements apply to you.

Prospective students with a Dutch diploma

If you possess one of the diplomas stated below then, in principle, you are directly admissible.

- VWO diploma: all profiles
- All HBO propaedeutic diplomas

Prospective students with a non-Dutch diploma

If you have a non-Dutch diploma that is equivalent to the Dutch VWO diploma you are, in principle, admissible to this programme. Check if this applies for your diploma.

Prospective students who do not meet the requirements

Entrance exam, Colloquium Doctum

If you do not have the required diploma, or do not meet the additional requirements, you can still qualify by passing an entrance exam (the so called Colloquium Doctum).

If you pass the Colloquium Doctum and submit the requested proof of language proficiency, you will qualify for enrolment in the bachelor's programme.

Prospective students who started a Bachelor in Psychology at another university

Prospective students who started a bachelor's programme in Psychology at another university and who wish to transfer to the Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience at Maastricht University must follow the same <u>admissions procedure</u> as all other prospective students (including the selection procedure). Note that you must apply as a first-year student in Studielink before **15 January 2022**.

In case you are offered a place in the bachelor's programme after completing the selection and once you are fully registered (including payment of the tuition fee) as a student at Maastricht University, you can request exemptions based on your previous education. The Board of Examiners will assess requests for credit transfer and will determine which courses you are exempted from. Language requirements English

As English is the language of instruction in this study programme, it is essential that your English language skills are good enough for you to undertake intensive and challenging academic courses that are taught and examined in English.

Prospective students who received their prior education in a non-EU/EEA country (handling fee)

Documents required for application process

During the application process for this study programme you will need to complete a number of tasks for which you will often have to upload documents. The list below gives you an insight into what documents you will (and might) need to prepare.

Required documents for all applicants to this study programme

- A recent passport picture The passport picture must satisfy certain <u>requirements</u>.
- A copy of your valid passport or your EU/EEA identity card Make a copy of the page with your personal details. Save this copy as 'passport copy' and not as 'passport picture'.
- A copy of your most recent list of grades and a copy of your diploma if you have already obtained it

Documents that might be required depending on your (academic) background

- Outcome of your language test with sufficient result (if applicable).
- Evidence of additional courses or tests in the required subjects (if applicable).
- A request for exemption (if applicable).

Please note:

Make sure to upload the documents in MyUM in **PDF** or **Word**-format. Do not upload **Zip files**, we cannnot open these files.

Only **complete** registrations will be taken into consideration.

All documents must be in **Dutch or English** and uploaded in the MyUM portal before: **15 January 2022, 23:59 CET**

How do we assess your application?

Fixus programme

The Bachelor in Psychology is a so-called fixus programme, this means that there is a limited number of places available. Below you will find more information on the selection procedure.

Selection procedure

The UM assesses your uploaded documents. You'll be informed by email whether you're admissible for the Selection procedure. If so, you'll be invited to participate in the selection procedure, which consists of an online questionnaire and online test. The invitation for the Selection will be sent in the week after the application deadline.

The Selection procedure covers the following subjects:

- motivation
- study attitude
- secondary education grades
- · three video lectures
- digital literature
- an online test

The Selection procedure will take about 4 to 6 hours to complete.

You can do all of the parts online at a time that suits you. You must complete the Selection procedure before **24 February 2022**, **17.00 CET**. Make sure you start on time. You can complete the Selection procedure in parts and even go back to change your answers (except to the 'high school grades'). **Please note**: once you have submitted the Selection procedure, it cannot be changed and you cannot retake it.

Assessment and ranking score

The criteria examined during your assessment are: your motivation, your knowledge and knowledge processing, your problem-solving ability, and self-reflection.

Based on the results the UM ranks the candidates. On **15 April 2022** you'll be informed about your ranking number via Studielink.

The allocation starts at the top of the ranking. Students who are offered a place, based on their ranking number, must **confirm/accept** their place in Studielink within 2 weeks.

Selection attempts

Over the years you're allowed to participate in the Selection procedure for this programme up to three times (Selection attempts). Each year, one Selection procedure takes place.

A Selection attempt will be registered if:

- You've (had) an active application for the Bachelor in Psychology in Studielink after 15 January 2022.
- You don't complete the selection procedure and still have (had) an active application after 15 January 2022.
- You withdraw your application after 15 January 2022.

No selection attempt will be registered if:

• You withdraw your application in Studielink before 16 January 2022.

Note: In case you fail your final high school exams, the used-up selection attempt can be annulled. Please contact the <u>Student Services Centre</u> of UM about this.
