- Psychiatry



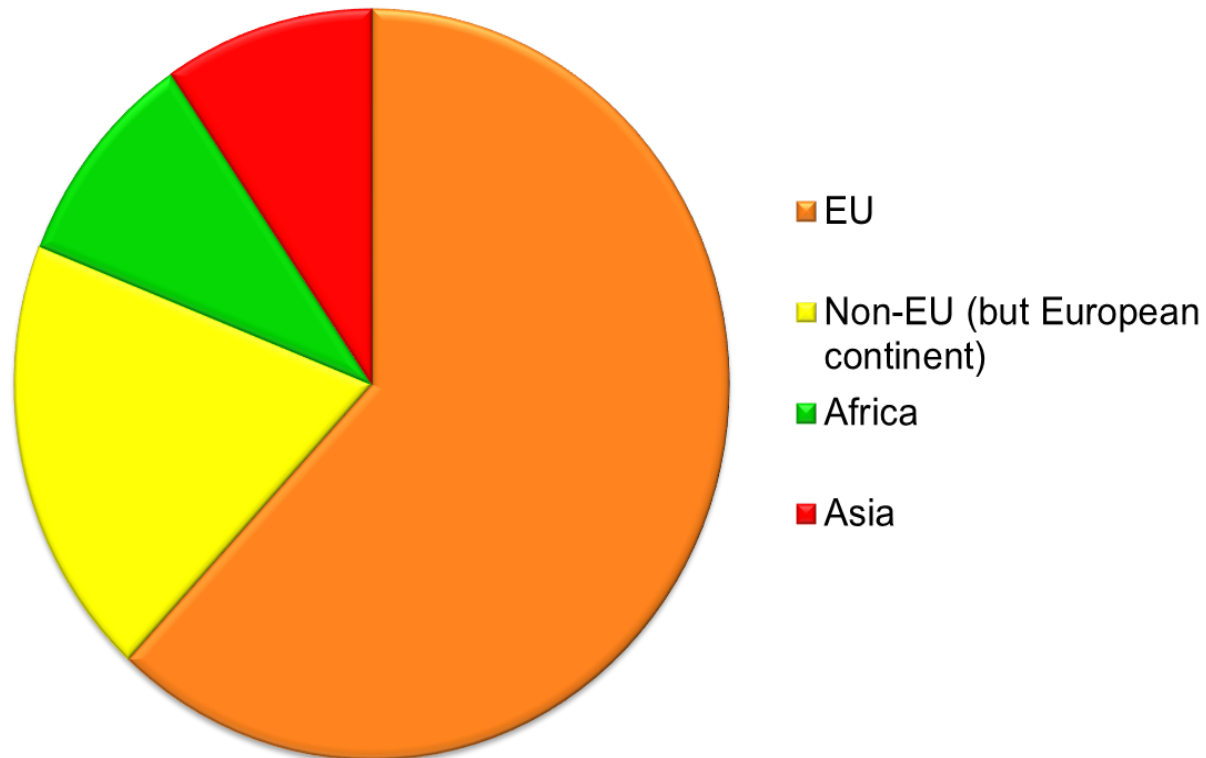
English track

Entrance Exam and admission

- Entrance Exam, **except** for those with an academic Bachelor or Master degree in Law or Criminology + TOEFL or IELTS
- Admissable are:
- Bachelors University College
- Bachelors or Masters in: European Studies, Psychology, Sociology or Social Studies, or in any other forensic related academic science



Entrance Exam

- Test yourself whether you qualify! Know what kind of reading you can expect.
- For those with no legal background extra study will be indispensable!
- See website for literature and case law to prepare for the entrance exam
- Written open book exam: main test is whether the applicant can identify legal problems, can apply legal knowledge by solving a case study, and has sufficient writing skills.
- Possibility for taking the test online under supervision if living further than 200 Km from Maastricht



Research honours track

- For a limited number of ambitious master students with a research interest.
- It allows these students to acquire research as well as presentation and writing skills in addition to the regular master programme
