


Can I come to campus?







I tested positive on a COVID-19 test: who should I inform? *

I tested positive on a COVID-19 test at the *GGD* or at a municipal public health service in another country.

Protected or not:

- Don't come to campus and stay at home.
- Inform the head of the Education Office of your faculty or the head of your department about the contacts you had at the university during the two days before the onset of your COVID-19 symptoms.
- Inform the Dutch GGD if you've tested positive outside the Netherlands. Please inform them by email 5005@ggdzl.nl stating your name, date of birth and phone number.

The head of the Education Office or the head of your department will, in collaboration with the GGD, inform those persons you were in contact with (never mentioning your name) in order to enable them to take safety measures.

* There is no obligation to inform the university about your positive COVID-19 result. However, we strongly advise you to do so to enable us to inform others so they can take the recommended safety measures to protect their health and others'. Your name will never be mentioned.
