

Dr. Christoph Rausch

Dr. Christoph Rausch is associate professor in the Humanities and Social Sciences at University College Maastricht and co-founding steering committee member of the Maastricht Centre for Arts and Culture, Conservation and Heritage. Dr. Rausch's main research interest is in the global relations between art and finance in the 21st century. Rausch studies the emergence and proliferation of new types of art storage spaces, including so-called freeports. He asks how an increasing financialization of art in and through storage problematizes public and private relations of ownership and display, speculation and risk, as well as regulation and taxation. During the academic year 2019/2020, Dr. Rausch is visiting researcher at the Centre for Art Market Studies in Berlin. In the fall semester of 2021, he is visiting research fellow at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Societies in Cologne.
