Admisson requirements



Academic requirements

- A bachelor's degree in law from
 - A Dutch university
 - An equivalent bachelor's degree in law from a non-Dutch university.

or

- A (bachelor) degree from
 - An institute of higher vocational education
 - A university in a field other than law.
- In the latter case an entrance exam is required (except for ILs).
 - November and May
 - Computer-based (on-line)
 - ELS = European law
 - G&L = International Law
 - ILs = International and European Law



Language requirements

- Applicants who are non-native English speakers and have their undergraduate degree in a language other than English must meet one of the following requirements:
 - IELTS test with a minimum overall score of 6.5
 - TOEFL with a minimum score of 575 paper-based (PBT), 233 computer-based (CBT), or 90 internet-based (iBT)
 - <u>Cambridge examinations</u>: CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English) with grade A, B or C or CAE (Certificate in Advanced English) with grade A, B or C+

Continuing/Selective Masters

- Continuing Masters: European Law School & Globalisation & Law
- Selective Master: International Laws
 - Above average grades
 - 7.5 (NL) or 2.1 (UK)
 - Language
 - Apply throughout the year
 - Letters of recommendation/motivation

European comparative law and human rights

- In addition to regular programme
- 1st semester
 - Foundations of the common law of Europe
 - Challenges in human rights research
 - Multidisciplinary study of law
 - Skills
- 2nd semester
 - Specialisation in comparative private law, public law or human rights
 - Extended master's thesis on the topic of their choice.
