

Dr. Maria Effinger

Maria Effinger studied Classical Archaeology, Art History and Ancient History at the Albert-Ludwigs-University of Freiburg im Breisgau. In 1995 she received her doctorate with a thesis on "Minoan Jewellery". She then completed a traineeship for the Higher Library Service in Frankfurt a.M. Since 1998 she has been working as a research assistant at the Heidelberg University Library, specialized in the field of art history. She is, among other things, Head of the Department of Publication Services, Cultural Heritage and Digital Humanities, Managing Director of the Heidelberg University Publishing House (heiUP) and Open Access Coordinator of the University. Her projects include the DFG-funded art history information service arthistoricum.net and the development of sustainable infrastructures for Open Access publishing. Another important focus of her work is the foundation and expansion of the portal "German Sales" (<http://artsales.uni-hd.de>), which provides free online access to more than 9,000 historical auction catalogues from the years 1901 to 1945 (mainly from Germany, Austria and Switzerland).
